# **National Board of Directors**

USA Triathlon elections are conducted in accordance with Article XXI of USA Triathlon's Bylaws. Nominations are open for volunteers to serve as General Directors on the National Board of Directors. For the 2013 election, directors will be elected from the following four (4) regions:

- <u>Florida Region</u>, which includes Florida except for the Panhandle west of the Apalachicola River;
- Mideast Region, which includes Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan and Ohio;
- Southeast Region, which includes Alabama, the Florida Panhandle west of the Apalachicola River, Georgia, Mississippi, South Carolina, and Tennessee; and
- Southwest Region, which includes Arizona, California and Nevada.

The director from each of these regions will be elected to serve a four (4) year term.

<u>Nominations for General Directors</u>. All persons meeting the following requirements shall be included on the ballot for the post of General Director in the region in which he or she

resides.

- (1) Incumbents. Any incumbent who is a member in good standing of USA Triathlon and who is not subject to term limits shall be placed on the ballot in the region in which he or she resides provided he/she submits the information required in paragraphs (2)(i),(ii) and (iv) below by the date nominations close.
- (2) Non-incumbents. An annual member in good standing of USA Triathlon who is also a citizen of the United States may submit a petition for his or her nomination to the General Directors post in the region in which he or she resides. The petition shall include the following:
  - (i) The name, complete address, day and evening phone numbers, e-mail address, and annual membership number of the nominee;
  - (ii) A written description of the nominee and his or her platform; the description shall not exceed 500 words;
  - (iii) A passport-type photo of the nominee;
  - (iv) One other photo of the nominee's choice;
  - (v) The signatures of at least 50 annual members in good standing of the USA Triathlon who reside in the region to be represented by the nominee. These signatures shall be accompanied by the printed name, complete address, day and evening phone numbers, e-mail address, annual membership number, and expiration date of said membership for each person signing the petition.

July 15 Call for Nominations posted on USA Triathlon website.

July 31 Nominations open for upcoming year.

August 31 Nominations close.

September 13\* Ballots made available to members, and ballots and

candidate information posted on USA Triathlon website.

October 15 Final day for ballots to be postmarked or electronically

recorded.

October 31 Election results announced.

November 15 Deadline to protest election.

December 15 Deadline to hear and decide any protest.

December 16 Election results certified.

January 1 New Board takes office.

### **Regional Councils**

Nominations are also open for volunteers to serve as members of all 10 Regional Councils. The 10 regions are:

- <u>Florida Region</u>, which includes Florida except for the Panhandle west of the Apalachicola River;
- <u>Mid-Atlantic Region</u>, which includes Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, North Carolina,
   Pennsylvania, Virginia, Washington D.C. and West Virginia;
- Mideast Region, which includes Illinois, Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan, and Ohio;
- <u>Midwest Region</u>, which includes Iowa, Kansas, Missouri, Minnesota, Nebraska, North Dakota, South Dakota, and Wisconsin;
- Northeast Region, which includes Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire,

New York, Rhode Island, and Vermont;

- <u>Pacific Northwest Region</u>, which includes Alaska, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, and Washington;
- <u>Rocky Mountain Region</u>, which includes, Colorado, New Mexico, Texas (only El Paso County), Utah, and Wyoming.
- <u>Southeast Region</u>, which includes Alabama, the Florida Panhandle west of the Apalachicola River, Georgia, Mississippi, South Carolina, and Tennessee;
- <u>South Midwest Region</u>, which includes Arkansas, Louisiana, Oklahoma, and Texas (excluding El Paso County);
- Southwest Region, which includes Arizona, California, and Nevada.

The terms for council members shall be staggered. Every two years, one half of the council seats shall come up for election. Council member terms are four years. Ballots shall specify the number of years of term remaining for each seat up for election. Winning candidates shall be seated in the order of number of votes received, with those gaining the highest number of votes filling seats with the longest terms.

<u>Nominations for Regional Council Members</u>. All persons meeting the following requirements shall be included on the ballot for the post of Council Member in the Region in which he or she resides:

- (1) Incumbents. Any incumbent who is an annual USAT member in good standing of the region will be placed upon the ballot provided they submit the information required in paragraphs (2) (a), (b) and (c) below.
- (2) Non-incumbents. An annual USA Triathlon member in good standing of the region who is also a citizen of the United States may submit a petition for his or her nomination to the Council in the region in which he or she resides. The petition will include the following:
  - a) The name, complete address, day and evening phone numbers, e-mail address, and annual membership number of the nominee.
  - b) A written description of the nominee and his or her platform; said description will not exceed 200 words.

c) A passport-type photo of the nominee.

Candidate information must be received by August 31, 2013 and may be mailed or emailed to either address above.
